Maybelline New York's make-up guru, Nigel Stanislaus explains how to get "Your skin looks amaze" foundation in three piece-of-cake steps.

## STEP ONE:

## Choose your lighting

"Applying your foundation in natural daylight will give you a better, more even result," says Nigel.

## STEP TWO:

## Work from the middle

"Start by applying your foundation to the sides of your nose as this is an area which tends to be more red or uneven."

## STEP THREE:

## Apply in light layers

"Lightly work the foundation from your nose out across your cheeks and forehead until the product is practically invisible. This will ensure you avoid looking as though you're wearing a mask."

## BASE BATTLE:

### To brush or not to brush?

## FOR

"A brush helps buff foundation into the skin for a longer-lasting finish," says L'Oréal Paris make-up artist Rae Morris.

## AGAINST

"Fingers help foundation bind better and blend more easily for a seamless finish. Plus there isn't as much wastage," says Nigel.

**THE VERDICT:** Whichever you use to apply foundation, one thing's for sure: bacteria causes breakouts. Using a brush? Clean it thoroughly at least once a week with a brush cleanser or dishwashing liquid. If applying with fingers, use a hand sanitizer first.
