Lash converters

Get lashes worth batting. BY SARA MCLEAN

HOW TO:

Apply falsies perfectly

Make-up artist Natalia Sprem reveals how to do it like a pro.







1. Give the lashes something to stick to by applying a base of foundation and a not-too-creamy concealer on the face and lids. "False lashes will slide off naked eyelids," says Sprem. Try: Clinique Touch Base for Eyes in Canvas (1), \$28, 1800 556 948, clinique.com.au.

TIP: A slick of liner before you put on your falsies will make them undetectable. If you apply afterwards, you risk moving them.



3. Curl lashes so they curve with your false ones. "Otherwise your real lashes will poke out underneath," says Sprem, Then apply two coats of mascara. Try: Tweezerman Deluxe Eyelash Curler (5), \$24.95, 1800 251 215.

4. Trim the strip, clipping from the outer end, inwards, until you get the right length for your lash line. Run the strip through a dollop of glue or use a cotton tip to get a thin, even coating across the whole length. Try: Duo False Lash Adhesive (6), \$15.95, from Kit, 1800 705 800, kitcosmetics.com.au.



2. To make your false lashes blend with your

natural ones, apply linerin three steps. "Start with

black pencil, go over with

a bit of black shadow, then

brush across your lash line.

pushing the colour into the

base of your lashes." Try: L'Oreal Paris Infallible

press and wriggle a flat

TIP: To make
the strip curve
naturally to your
lash line, bend
them gently back
and forth
between your
fingers before
applying.



5. Tilt your head back and look down into the mirror. "This gives the clearest view of your lash line, which is where you want to place the strip." Falsies tend to creep off the outer corners first, so apply the strip from that side, inwards.
